Information for this database was obtained for town parcels within the Ogunquit F Ogunquit Sewer District and the Land Use office. Further information and clarification was obtained from the Vision Government Solutions Online Assessment database. When discrepancies were found between town files and the Online Vision database the most recent Trio Assessment card was consulted for information. Town and/or ME DEP septic approval dates were not easily located for many parcels. Building age dates were noted for the majority of the septic and remaining unknown parcels to identify systems possibly 30 years or older.

A total of 914 parcels exist within the Ogunquit River watershed. Approximately 80% of the 914 parcels could be matched by Map-Block-Lot-Unit number to a wastewater utility category in the Vision database. Of the 914 parcels found within the watershed 593 parcels are connected to public sewer and 321 parcels have a septic system. 5 parcels were found in *both* the public and septic records. The Vision History database recognized 172 of the 223 septic parcels within the watershed, 45 of which have a history within the past 5 years including 2015. There are 105 remaining unknown parcels, 30 of which are not found in Vision's database.

Category 1, top priority parcels: Unknown parcels without a ME DEP or Town approval located in town files (i.e., there is no clear record of a septic system at either the town or ME DEP files). Parcels are ranked by risk to surface water in case of a system failure by building age from newest to oldest, houses built before 1985 are shown in red.

Category 2, second priority parcels: Septic parcels without a ME DEP or Town approval located in town files which do not exist in the towns Septic Service Database and have not been serviced in the past 5 years. Parcels are ranked by risk to surface water in case of a system failure by building age from oldest to newest, houses built before 1985 are shown in red.

Category 3, third priority parcels: Parcels without a ME DEP or Town approval located in town files which are connected to public sewer **AND** exist in the Town Septic Service Database but have not been serviced in the past 5 years. Parcels are ranked by risk to surface water in case of a system failure by building age from oldest to newest, houses built before 1985 are shown in red.

Category 4, Fourth priority parcels: Known septic parcels identified within the Vision History database which have not been serviced in the past 5 years including 2015. Parcels are ranked by risk to surface water in case of a system failure by building age from oldest to newest, houses built before 1985 are shown in red.

Category 5, Fifth priority parcels: Parcels with no wastewater utility listing visible in Vision according to Vision.

Category 6, Low priority parcels: Known septic parcels identified within the Vision History database which have been serviced in the past 5 years including 2015. Parcels are ranked by risk to surface water in case of a system failure by building age from oldest to newest, houses built before 1985 are shown in red.



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
