

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION

1967

To Cecil F. Perkins, A Police Officer in the Ogunquit Village Corporation in the Town of Wells, County of York and State of Maine: GREETINGS:

In the Name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Ogunquit Village Corporation qualified by law to vote in Corporation affairs, to meet in the Firemen's Hall in said Corporation on Monday, the third day of April 1967, A.D. at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

- ARTICLE 1: To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting
- ARTICLE 2: To choose five Overseers, Clerk, Treasurer, three members of the Budget Committee and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 3: To see if the Corporation will vote to raise the pay of all its employees by 10% so as to bring them in line with other localities.
Budget Committee recommends Yes.
- ARTICLE 4: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,123.00 to purchase a new mosler safe for the Corporation Office.
Budget Committee recommends \$2,123.00
- ARTICLE 5: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to put a foundation and cellar under the Garden Cottage which we are going to use for our new Officers.
Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00
- ARTICLE 6: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$8,500.00 for the salaries of the Corporation Officers for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$8,500.00
- ARTICLE 7: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the running expenses of Firemen's Hall and the New Village Offices which will include the Police Department for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00
- ARTICLE 8: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$4,300.00 for the Contingent Account (Office Expenses) for the ensuing year including Manager's expenses and clerk hire.
Budget Committee recommends \$4,300.00
- ARTICLE 9: To see what sum of money the Corporation will appropriate for Indebtedness and Interest for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$14,622.50
- ARTICLE 10: To see what sum of money the Corporation will appropriate for Temporary Loans Interest for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$500.00
- ARTICLE 11: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,669.35 for Insurance for the ensuing year.
Budtet Committee recommends \$3,669.35
- ARTICLE 12: To see if the Corporation will vote to authoriz~~e~~ the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow sufficient money for the necessary running expenses of the Corporation until such time as the Corporation shall receive the amount due from the Town of Wells, and from February 15, to the date of the annual meeting.
Budget Committee recommends Yes.

- ARTICLE 13: To see if the Corporation will authorize the Overseers to install a Street Light on the Capt. Thomas Road on Pole J.08 near the residence of Bernard Keene and the approach to the Sherburne Bridge, and if so will they appropriate the sum of \$31.80 for same. On petition of Bernard W. Keene.
Budget Committee recommends Yes.
- ARTICLE 14: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$12,974.80 for Street Lighting and Traffic signals, for the ensuing. This amount includes \$438.60 for new lights on Beach Street, and \$1,051.80 for new lights on Shore Road.
Budget Committee recommends \$12,974.80
- ARTICLE 15: To see if the Corporation will vote to install a Hydrant on Josias Lane between the residences of Stephen Smith and Glen Ramsdell, and if so will they appropriate the sum of \$160.00 for same. On petition of Willis Littlefield and twelve others.
Budget Committee recommends yes, and the Fire Chief Bernard Keene select the location
- ARTICLE 16: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,055.00 for Hydrant rental for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$10,055.00
- ARTICLE 17: To see if the Corporation will vote to accept the return of the Overseers of the now Private Way known as Josias Lane, providing it meets the requirements of the Ogunquit Village Corporation Subdivision Ordinances, and plan filed in the Corporation Office which has been signed by the Ogunquit Village Corporation Planning Board, on petition of Willis Littlefield.
Budget Committee recommends yes.
- ARTICLE 18: To see if the Corporation will vote to set the pay for truck hire, for Plowing snow at \$7.00 per hour and \$6.00 per hour for hauling snow and general trucking.
Budget Committee recommends yes.
- ARTICLE 19: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$20,500.00 for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$20,500.00
- ARTICLE 20: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the upkeep and maintenance of the Ogunquit Fire Co., for the ensuing year, all bills to be approved by the Chief, Bernard W. Keene.
Budget Committee recommends \$7,000.00
- ARTICLE 21: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$19,000.00 for the maintenance of Highways, Roads, Parking Lots, and Bridges for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$19,000.00
- ARTICLE 22: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$8,500.00 plus Excise Tax for snow removal, sanding and Winter Highway maintenance for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$8,500.00
- ARTICLE 23: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for our share of the Cost of the Town Dump on Route 9B in Wells for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$3,300.00
- ARTICLE 24: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the repair of Sidewalks for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$800.00
- ARTICLE 25: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the care of shade trees for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$2,500.00

ARTICLE 26:

To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for the upkeep of the Beaches for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends use of Rest Room, and Beach Parking Fees.

ARTICLE 27:

To see if the Corporation will vote to subsidize the Ogunquit Sewer District, and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$30,000.00 to pay towards the interest on the Bond Issue.

Budget Committee recommends \$30,000.00

ARTICLE 28:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended to assist in financing the Hot Lunch Program of the Elementary School in Ogunquit.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00

ARTICLE 29:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,350.00 for repairs and maintenance of the Marginal Way for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,350.00

ARTICLE 30:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$8,465.00 for Lifeguard Service for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$8,465.00

ARTICLE 31:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$11,700.00 for the expenses of the Publicity Bureau for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$11,700.00

ARTICLE 32:

To see whether or not the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the Natural Resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Budget Committee recommends \$300.00

ARTICLE 33:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appoint a Publicity Committee for the ensuing year, consisting of, Mr. Russell Ireland, Mr. John Parella, Mr. Harold Staples, Mr. J. Lawrence Smith, Mr. Carl Perkins, Mr. Chris Ritter, Mr. George Toward, Mr. Edward Hipple.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 34:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the support of the support of the Memorial Library for the ensuing year.

Budget committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 35:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the support of Locust Grove Cemetery for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 36:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the maintenance of Riverside Cemetery for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 37:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,110.00 for the purpose of defraying the Corporation's share of Social Security of its employees for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,110.00

ARTICLE 38:

To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Parks and Recreation for the ensuing year. \$500.00 of this is to be spent in fixing up the Ball Park to meet the requirements of the Little League.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00

ARTICLE 39: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Legal and Engineering Fees for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

ARTICLE 40: To see if the Corporation will vote to raise the Seasonal Parking Fees at the Beach Parking Lots from \$5.00 to \$10.00 and the Monthly Fees from \$3.00 to \$5.00.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 41: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$135.00 to be paid to the Town of Wells as the Corporation's share of the cost of their Representative of the Armed Service Committee in Wahsington, on request of Mr. Hamlin Lord Chairman of the Wells Board of Selectmen.

Budget Committee recommends \$135.00

ARTICLE 42: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate a sum of money and if so how much if a sufficient amount of land in back of Jacobs Garage can be leased, and to supply two attendants, at the request of the Chamber of Commerce. Lease to be approved by the Board of Overseers.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00

ARTICLE 43: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for three Bulletin Boards, with plastic letters similar to Hotel directories, to be plac'd one each at the Beach, Cove and Ogunquit Swuare, at the request of the Chamber of Commerce.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00

ARTICLE 44: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be paid to the Chamber of Commerce to be spent at their Discretion.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,000.00

ARTICLE 45: To see if the Corporation will Vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for new Sidewalk construction. To continue the Berwick Road sidewalk to the top of Coles Hill, and to build one on Ocean St. from U.S. Highway #1 to the Foot Bridge Parking Lot, providing there is no land damage involved.

Budget Committee recommends \$10,000.00

ARTICLE 46: Shall the following amendements to the Ordinances Relating to Sanitation be enacted?

Ordinance Relating to Sanitation in Sections 1,2, and 9 wherever the word "Corporation" appears replace with the words "Ogunquit Sewer District."

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 47: Shall the following addition to the Ordinances relating to Ogunquit Beach Area, Perkins Cove and Marginal Way be enacted?

SURFING:

No surfing shall be allowed in any of the waters bordering the Village Corporation except within an appropriately marked area at Ogunquit Beach southerly of the southerly life line and northerly of the Beachmere markers, or at other areas from time to time that the Overseers of the Corporation may designate. ~~and the Board of Overseers shall~~ Yes.

ARTICLE 48:

Shall the following ordinance relating to persons sleeping in vehicles or in public places be enacted?

No persons shall sleep in any vehicle, on the Beach, on the Marginal Way or any other public place within the Village Corporation except in appropriate accommodations for that purpose.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 49:

Shall the following ammendment to the Shell Fish Digging Ordinance Dated January 17, 1966 be enacted, by adding to Section 1, a Subsection D?

Titled Non-Resident:

Meaning and intended a Non-Resident Tax paying property owner, may obtain a \$2.00 license, to dig (1/2) one-half bushel of clams per day.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 50:

Parking is probibited on either side of Stearns Road from Shore Road [redacted] easterly to a point at C.M.P. pole #18 between June 15th and September 15th.

ARTICLE 51:

Parking is prohibited on the Southerly side of Ontio Hill except from a point 50 feet westerly of C.M.P. pole #39 easterly to a point marked by C.M.P. #13 between June 15th and September 15th.

ARTICLE 52:

Parking is prohibited on either side of Frazier Pasture Road from Shore Rd to Foot path of Marginal Way at Ralph Booths, between June 15th and September 15th.

ARTICLE 53:

No person shall operate a motor vehicle upon any street or way or any other place within the limits of the Village Corporation so as to make or cause any loud, unusu_al or unnecessary noise against the peace, quiet and good order of the Village.

ARTICLE 54:

Ammend to read "The operation of motor vehicles and the riding of bicycles is prohibited on all sidewalks within the Village and upon the Marginal Way."

ARTICLE 55:

Amend to read: "Motor Vehicles are prohibited within the Beach Area except in the parking areas provided from the. In case vehicles are needed for gathering seaweed or wreckage written permission shall be secured from the Chief of Police.

ARTICLE 56:

Rocky Lane is hereby made a one-way Street, East to West from Park Lane to Shore Road.
