

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION

1966

To Cecil F. Perkins, a Police Officer in the Ogunquit Village Corporation in the Town of Wells, County of York and State of Maine: GREETINGS:

In the Name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Ogunquit Village Corporation qualified by law to vote in Corporation affairs, to meet in the Firemen's Hall in said Corporation on Monday, the fourth day of April 1966, A.D. at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1: To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2: To choose five Overseers, Clerk, Treasurer, three members of the Budget Committee and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Corporation will appropriate the sum of \$7,740.00 for the salaries for the Corporation officers for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$7,740.00

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Corporation will appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for the running expenses of Firemen's Hall for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$1,900.00

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Corporation will appropriate the sum of \$3,670.00 for the Contingent Account (Office Expense) for the ensuing year, including Manager's expenses and \$1,300.00 for Clerk hire.  
Budget Committee recommends \$3,670.00

ARTICLE 6: To see what sum of money the Corporation will appropriate for Indebtedness and Interest for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$27,810.00

ARTICLE 7: To see what sum of money the Corporation will appropriate for Temporary Loans Interest for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$500.00

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,700.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$2,700.00

ARTICLE 9: To see if the Corporation will vote to authorize the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow sufficient money for the necessary running expenses of the Corporation until such time as the Corporation shall receive the amount due from the Town of Wells, and from February 15 to the date of the annual meeting.  
Budget committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$11,484.40 for Street Lighting and Traffic Signals for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$11,484.40

ARTICLE 11: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,055.00 for Hydrant Rental for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$10,055.00

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Corporation will vote to set the Police Chief's salary at \$120.20 per week.  
Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 13: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$18,515.00 for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.  
Budget Committee recommends \$18,515.00

ARTICLE 14: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the upkeep and maintenance of the Ogunquit Fire Co., for the ensuing year, all bills to be approved by the Chief, Bernard W. Keene.

Budget Committee recommends \$7,000.00

ARTICLE 15: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$19,000.00 for the maintenance of Highways, Roads, Parking Lots, and Bridges for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$19,000.00

ARTICLE 16: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for snow removal, sanding and Winter Highway maintenance for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,500.00 plus Excise Taxes.

ARTICLE 17: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for our share of the cost of the Town Dump on Route 9B in Wells for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,300.00

ARTICLE 18: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the repair of Sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$800.00

ARTICLE 19: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the care of Shade Trees for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

ARTICLE 20: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for the upkeep of the Beaches for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends use of Rest Room and Beach Parking Fees

ARTICLE 21: To see if the Corporation will vote to subsidize the Ogunquit Sewer Dist., and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$30,000.00 to pay towards the interest on the Bond issue.

Budget Committee recommends \$30,000.00

ARTICLE 22: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be expended to assist in financing the Hot Lunch Program of the Elementary School in Ogunquit.

Budget Committee recommends \$400.00

ARTICLE 23: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for repairs to and maintenance of the Marginal Way including \$1,000.00 for a chain Link Fence and incidentals along Mrs. Graham's Property.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,200.00

ARTICLE 24: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,800.00 for Lifeguard service for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$7,800.00

ARTICLE 25: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$11,700.00 for the expenses of the Publicity Bureau for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$11,700.00

ARTICLE 26: To see whether or not the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

Budget Committee recommends \$300.00

ARTICLE 27: To see if the Corporation will vote to appoint a Publicity Committee for the ensuing year, consisting of, Mrs. Weldon Morrison, Mr. Russell Ireland, Mr. John Parella, Mr. Harold Staples, Mr. J. Lawrence Smith, Mr. Carl Perkins, Mr. Chris Ritter, Mr. George Towar, Mr. Edward Hipple.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 28: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 plus the present Police cruiser to purchase a new Police Car.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00

ARTICLE 29: To see if the Corporation will vote to raise the hourly pay of the regular Highway employees by 10c per hour.

Budget Committee recommends 10c per hour.

ARTICLE 30: To see if the Corporation will vote to authorize the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow (\$45,000.00) dollars at the lowest rate of interest possible to be paid in five (5) years, for the purpose of buying the property known as the Willows, and including the land in back of that property where the Sparhawk Domitory is located, to within Ten (10) feet of said Domitory, excluding the so called Laundry or Cooks House, which the Fire Co. now owns. Property to be transfered on or about September 15, 1966. The Ogunquit Sparhawk Inc., would have a right of way over the property to maintain their water and Sewer lines, and access to the Domitory from Shore Road. The Ogunquit Sparhawk Inc., agrees to give the Ogunquit Village Corporation, the first option on the Domitory and land when other arrangements for helps quarters can be made. + *Amend*.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE 31: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Memorial Library for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

ARTICLE 32: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the maintenance of the Locust Grove Cemetery for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 33: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the maintenance of Riverside Cemetery for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 34: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,450.00 \$2,850.00 for Harbor Master's Salary, and \$2,600.00 for the salary of general maintenance man.

Budget Committee recommends \$5,450.00

ARTICLE 35: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of defraying the Corporation's share of Social Security of it's employees for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

ARTICLE 36: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Parks and recreation for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,000.00

ARTICLE 37: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,567.00 for two portable Radios to add to our present setup.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,567.00

ARTICLE 38: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Legal and Engineering Fees for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

ARTICLE 39: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$9,800.00 to purchase a front end loader for use on Winter maintenance, snow removal and various other projects.

Budget Committee recommends \$9,800.00

ARTICLE 40: To see if the Corporation will vote to authorize the Town of Wells to charge the same fees as Ogunquit, at the Moody Beach Parking Lot. All fees collected to be used for the operation of the Parking Lot and Public Rest Rooms and the cleaning and maintenance of the Ogunquit Beach South of the Wells Ogunquit line.

Budget Committee recommends leave up to meeting.

ARTICLE 41: To see if the Corporation will vote to allow the Town of Wells to increase the size of the Moody Beach Parking Lot One Hundred and Fifty (150) feet South of it's present Southern boundry, and to build new Rest Rooms on same, provided they fence off the Ogunquit Sewer District right of way.

Budget Committee recommends leave up to meeting.

ARTICLE 42: To see if the Corporation will vote to have a dry hydrant at the North End of the Boat yard at the Cove, and if so will they appropriate a sum of money for same.

Budget Committee recommends yes.

ARTICLE 43: To see if the Corporation will vote to build a sidewalk on the North side of Berwick Road from Route #1 to Dana Road, and if so will they vote to authorize the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow Four thousand (\$4,000.00 dollars for same at the lowest rate of interest possible to be paid for in two years.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00 by borrowing.

ARTICLE 44: To see if the Corporation will vote to build a Bath House at the Beach on petition of Lincoln Yalden President of the O.V.I.A. and others, and if so will they authorize the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow up to \$23,000.00 at the lowest rate of interest possible to be paid for in Six years out of Beach income. Building would be 21' X 210' situated on the West side of Parking Lot from the Road South along the River.

Budget Committee recommends Indefinite Postponement.

ARTICLE 45: To see if the Corporation will vote to take some action in getting out a new Cottage Directory and appropriate a sum of money for same, on petition of Cecil F. Perkins.

Budget Committee recommends \$900.00

ARTICLE 46: To see if the Corporation will vote to take over the light already installed on Lixon Run Road, and add this to the Street Lighting account, on petition of O.W. Perkins and thirteen others.

Budget Committee recommends Indefinite Postponement.

ARTICLE 47: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Band Concerts for the coming season, on petition of the Ogunquit Resort Association.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00

ARTICLE 48: To see if the Ogunquit Village Corporation will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Ogunquit as follows:

To include the property of Evelyn L. McLaughlin bounded on the East by the Ogunquit River; on the South by land now or formerly of Letitia S. Street; on the West by other land of said McLaughlin; and on the North by land of C. Herbert Littlefield and now or formerly of Judith B. Olliver, being that property formerly known as "Fieldstone", formerly owned by Kathleen V. Hoyt, within the boundaries of the limited business district as set out in said zoning ordinance.

These funds were spent for Architects fees and miscellaneous expenses for the proposed Ogunquit Civic Center, by the following committee.

ARTICLE 50: To see if the Ogunquit Village Corporation will vote to release to Rose and Jules Voignier, any interest that they may have in that portion of land, now deeded to Rose and Jules Voignier, by the Ogunquit Sparhawk Inc., where the old Sparhawk Sewer Plant is located, and for all intents and purposes turned over to the Ogunquit Sewer District, by referendum vote of the Corporation April 1, 1963.
