

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL MEETING
of the
OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION
April 7, 1980

TO WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Ogunquit Village Corporation,
in the Town of Wells, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Ogunquit Village Corporation, qualified by law to vote in Corporation affairs, to meet in the Judson Dunaway Community Center in said Corporation on Monday, the seventh day of April, 1980, A.D., at one o'clock in the afternoon until six o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on Articles 1 and 2; and to notify and warn said voters to meet in the same place in said Corporation on the same day at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on Articles 3 through 43:

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: To elect the following officers for the terms so noted or until such time as a successor is elected and qualified:

- A. One (1) Overseer, term ending July 1, 1980.
- B. A Clerk, term ending July 1, 1980.
- C. A Treasurer, term ending July 1, 1980.
- D. Two (2) Charter Revision Commission members, terms ending July 1, 1980.

- (a) Payment of an hourly charge at an average rate of \$75.00 per hour plus expenses, or;
- (b) On a contingency basis of 25 percent of the amount of the recovery plus expenses through Superior Court trial and in the event of an appeal to the Law Court, then on a contingency basis of 30 percent plus expenses. In the event this manner of compensation is chosen, the the Board of Overseers is authorized to enter into a written contingent fee agreement.

ARTICLE 27: To see if the Corporation will retain the services of Dunham and Crook, Certified Public Accountants, at an average rate of \$40.00 per hour to provide the necessary accounting services and expert witness services in the trial of the civil action mentioned in Article 25 of this Warrant.

ARTICLE 28: To see if the Corporation will carry forward for the benefit of and/or assign to the Town of Ogunquit, effective July 1, 1980, all causes of action, choses in action, contracts rights, accounts receivable and any other right or claim it may own which is not fully liquidated as of July 1, 1980.

- d. A single Road Commissioner shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen for a term not to exceed three (3) years.
- e. A Clerk/Treasurer shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen and shall perform Clerk and Treasurer duties in accordance with State Statutes.
- f. A Tax Collector shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen.

NOTE: The first year of the terms of office of these officials shall expire on the date of the annual meeting of the town in 1981.
