

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL REFERENDUM

OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT, MAINE

Tuesday - June 8, 1982

TO WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the Name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to vote by referendum ballot at the Dunaway Community Center, in said town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of June, 1982, A.D., from ten o'clock in the morning until eight o'clock in the evening, on the following questions:

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said vote.

ARTICLE 2: To decide the following question by referendum ballot:

"Shall the Town vote to adopt the following revisions concerning Amusement Centers in the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ogunquit dated March 1976 (as amended April 2, 1979 and March 6, 1982)?"

Sec. 1 Chapter I, Section III, Definition:

delete: "Amusement Center Any indoor place or enclosure in which is maintained or operated for the amusement, patronage, or recreation of the public, any coin-operated amusement device of any description."

add: "Amusement Center In the General Business District, as a Special Exception and not combined with any other use, an indoor use consisting of one or more electronic or video games, pinball machines, or devices of similar function or description, which are activated by coins, tokens, discs, remote control, or any other means for public amusement, patronage, recreation, or entertainment. It shall not include one, two, or three such devices as an incidental or accessory use in other business districts. Other limitations and requirements for amusement centers and incidental use are found in Chapter 3, Amusement Licensing Ordinance, of Title 9, Business Ordinance, Ogunquit Municipal Code."

Sec. 2 Chapter II, Section II (D) (2) (p. 56)

delete: ":" after "arenas"

add: to "Theatres, auditoria, churches, arenas:" "and amusement centers:"

ARTICLE 3: To decide the following question by referendum ballot:

"Shall the Town vote to adopt an ordinance entitled "Amusement Licensing Ordinance" to be known as Chapter 3 of Title 9, Municipal Code of the Town of Ogunquit, dated April 1982, as recommended by the Board of Selectmen?"

ARTICLE 4: To decide the following question by referendum ballot:

"Shall the Town vote to adopt the National Fire Safety Code 101 dated 1981 as recommended by the Ogunquit Planning Board?"

Given under our hands in Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine, on this first day of June, 1982, A.D.; further, that the Board of Selectmen hereby gives notice that the polls will be open for voting purposes at ten o'clock in the morning or as soon as possible thereafter of the day of said Meeting Vote and that the polls will not be closed earlier than eight o'clock in the evening of said day.
