

**WARRANT FOR THE SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT
Tuesday, June 13, 2006**

TO: PATRICIA L.ARNAUDIN, Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York
State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Center in said Town on Tuesday, **the thirteenth day of June, 2006 A.D.** at nine o'clock in the morning until eight o'clock in the evening to vote by secret ballot on **Articles 1- 6.**

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to appropriate, from surplus fund balance, a sum not to exceed \$100,000 to fund the costs of Capital Improvement Projects as approved by the voters at the April 1, 2006 Annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to expend no more than \$9,000, from undesignated surplus funds, for the purchase of a 2003 Crown Victoria police vehicle for use by the Department's Lieutenant? [NOTE: Vehicle cost - \$9,995 less \$995 trade-in toward amount to be expended (\$9,000)].

“The citizens of Ogunquit, Maine, hereby request that our two United States Senators, Olympia Snowe and Susan Collins make a motion to be voted on by the United States Senate to censure President George Bush for the following reasons:

- His approval of an illegal domestic spying program of U.S. citizens when legal options were available to him;
 - His undertaking of a pre-emptive war in Iraq based upon intelligence information that misled the U.S. Congress and American people;
 - He has refused to veto even one spending bill during his Presidency, while his financial policies raised our national debt from roughly five trillion dollars to over eight trillion dollars.






A person who is not registered to vote may not vote in any election. A voter who is not enrolled in a political party may not vote in a primary election.




