

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center in said Town on Wednesday, the twenty-fifth day of June, 1986 A.D. at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening then and there to act on Articles 1 through 8.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) for the purchase of 34.9 acres of land on the Captain Thomas Road in Ogunquit and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute the purchase subject to the conditions of sale imposed by the Maine Turnpike Authority and subject to the conditions agreed to by the Board of Selectmen in an Indenture Agreement signed on May 6, 1986?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Thousand, Three Hundred and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$12,325) to prepay the remaining debt on the Aerial Ladder Truck?

ARTICLE 4: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred and Forty-Six Dollars and Forty-Five Cents (\$846.45) to the Police Department Budget and the sum of Seven Hundred and Eighty Dollars and Fourteen Cents (\$780.14) to the Perkins Cove Budget to allow for the payment of earned longevity increases as provided for in the Town of Ogunquit Personnel Rules?

ARTICLE 5: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$760) for wage adjustments and the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for tax collection expenses in the General Government Administration Budget?

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand, Three Hundred and Twenty Dollars (\$1,320) to be allocated among the Police, Highway and Lifeguard Budgets to make the Town's portable radios compatible to private line transmissions in order to overcome outside interference?

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to accept an additional sum of money identified in a list prepared by the Town Manager and to be presented at the Meeting for the purpose of financing improvements to the Ogunquit Veterans Park and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to expend such funds for the purpose stated?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to accept a parcel of land from the Estate of Dorothea Jacobs Grant as described in a Deed of Distribution executed by the Personal Representatives of the Estate on February 3, 1986 and recorded in the York County Registry of Deeds in Book 3758 and Page 10 on February 12, 1986.

NOTE: This is the same parcel of land already conveyed to the Town by Quitclaim Deed by Richard Winkler and accepted by the voters in Article 33 at the 1985 Annual Town Meeting.

The Board of Selectmen hereby give notice that the meeting will be held at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening of said day. Given under our hand this thirteenth day of June, 1986 A.D.
