

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

OF THE

TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

To WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center in said Town on Thursday, the nineteenth day of July, 1984 A.D. at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening then and there to act on Articles 1 through 15.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) for legal fees?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the Wells-Ogunquit Historical Society?

ARTICLE 4: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) for the purpose of a pick-up truck for the Highway Department?

ARTICLE 5: Shall the Town vote to transfer monies collected in donated funds from the General Fund to the Ogunquit Green Development Fund?

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand, Six Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$2,660) to employ a parking lot attendant for the Ogunquit Green parking lot for the 1984 summer season?

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) from the Marginal Way Restoration Account to the Marginal Way Repair Account to cover cost overdrafts in the project?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to raise and re-appropriate the sum of Six Hundred and Twenty-Nine Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$629.25) for a bill to Two-Way Communications for a bill approved in 1983, which bill was not received until 1984 after auditors closed appropriations to surplus.

ARTICLE 9: Shall the Twon vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) to cover telephone expenses for the remainder of the fiscal year to the Police Department.

ARTICLE 10: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to donate all monies remaining in the Ogunquit Civic Center account to the Ogunquit Music Center to be used by it, consistent with its Charter and By-laws.

ARTICLE 11: Shall the Town vote to accept certain property located at Route One and School Street from Reynold and Elisa Drews?

ARTICLE 12: Shall the Town vote to accept and reaffirm the acceptance of property conveyed to the Ogunquit Beach District, Ogunquit, Maine, by Walter M. Perkins of Ogunquit Village, in the Town of Wells, in the County of York and State of Maine by deed dated December 4, 1942, and recorded in the York Registry of Deeds, Book 16, Page 43.

ARTICLE 13: Shall the Town vote to borrow Eleven Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$11,500) short term and appropriate same for a Police Cruiser? Repayment will be made from parking fines in excess of Twenty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$23,000) as approved at March 3, 1984 Town Meeting?

ARTICLE 14: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Selectmen to pay a new Town Manager a salary not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) per annum?

ARTICLE 15: To enact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Board of Selectmen hereby give notice that the meeting will be held at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening of said day. Given under our hands this eleventh day of July, 1984, A.D.


