

WARRANT FOR A SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center on School Street in said Town on Tuesday, August 20, 1991 A.D. at ten o'clock in the morning until seven o'clock in the evening to vote by secret ballot on Articles 1, 2 and 3; and to notify and warn said voters to meet in the same place in said Town on Tuesday, August 20, 1991 A.D. at eight o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on Articles 4 through 9.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside over said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to repeal the present Ogunquit Zoning Ordinance (Title X of the Municipal Ordinances) to adopt a new Zoning Ordinance with the repeal and the adoption to be effective immediately upon approval of the voters?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Charter that created the Ogunquit Sewer District be amended to increase the total authorized indebtedness of the District from \$4,000,000 to \$7,000,000?

ARTICLE 4: Shall the Town vote to approve the Order of Discontinuance for Beach Street dated June 18, 1991 (herein incorporated as Appendix A to this Warrant) and filed with the Ogunquit Town Clerk?

ARTICLE 5: Shall the Town vote to accept Beach Street as a Town Way as laid out and described in the Selectmen's Return and Condemnation Order dated June 18, 1991 (herein incorporated as Appendix B to this Warrant) and filed with the Ogunquit Town Clerk and further shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Four Dollars (\$24) to be paid as damages for the land so taken?

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Town vote to approve the Order of Discontinuance for a portion of Agamenticus Road dated July 2, 1991 (herein incorporated as Appendix C to this Warrant) and filed with the Ogunquit Town Clerk?

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to accept the gift of a bench from Thomas Backiel of Bangor, Maine to be located at the Information Bureau on Route 1 and to be dedicated in honor of his parents?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to accept the gift of a bench from Marian Leahey of Milford, Connecticut to be located at the Footbridge Parking Lot and to be dedicated in honor of former long-time summer resident Ethel Kelly?

ARTICLE 9: Shall the Town vote to adopt the following amendments to Title IX of the Town's Ordinances (Amusement Ordinance):

Amend Title IX, Section 301.3 as follows: This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the powers granted to the Town by ~~30 MRSA Section 1917, 30 MRSA Section 2151~~ 30A MRSA 3001 and 28A MRSA 1054.

Amend Title IX, Section 308 as follows: Appeals from the decision of the Code Enforcement Officer shall be to the Municipal Officers and appeals from the decision of the Municipal Officers shall be to the Courts Zoning Board of Appeals in accordance with the provisions of 28A MRSA 1054 (8) and 30a MRSA 2691 (4).

The Board of Selectmen hereby gives Notice that the polls shall be open for voting purposes at ten o'clock in the morning or as soon as possible thereafter on the date of said Meeting and that polls will not be closed earlier than seven o'clock in the evening of the same day.

The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any error or change a name or address on the voting list, to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments.

A person who is not registered as a voter may not vote in any election. A voter who is not enrolled in a political party may not vote in a primary election.



ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE




ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE

The Municipal Officers of the Town of Ogunquit, County of York, State of Maine, hereby ORDER the DISCONTINUANCE of that portion of Agamenticus Road, now relocated and removed, which ran approximately 225' in an easterly direction starting at the York Town Line. This action is being taken in conformance with the terms of the dedication of land for highway purposes made by Joseph Young and Florence Young and the subsequent relocation of a portion of the roadway which dedication and relocation were approved by the adoption of Articles 20 and 21 at the April 7-9, 1990, Annual Town Meeting.






