

WARRANT FOR A SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: MICHAEL W. PARDUE, Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit,
County of York and State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center, in said Town on Tuesday, the tenth day of December, 1996 A.D., at 7 o'clock in the evening to vote on Articles 1 through 12.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside over said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) from the Selectmen's Contingency Fund to the Police Department Account to offset the unanticipated expenditures incurred by the Animal Control Division?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) from the Selectmen's Contingency Fund to the General Government Administration Account (Town Manager) to offset increased wages for the new Town Manager's position?

ARTICLE 4: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) from the Selectmen's Contingency Fund to the Dunaway Center Account to offset unanticipated expenditures associated with the reconstruction of the front stairs and furnace repairs as a result of the failure of the power venting mechanism?

ARTICLE 5: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000) from the unexpended balances in the Insurance Account to the General Government Operations (Selectmen) Account to offset unanticipated legal fees?

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Town vote to appropriate a sum of money not to exceed Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000) from the Town's unappropriated fund balance (surplus) due to the increased costs of tipping fees associated with Regional Waste Systems (RWS)?

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to rename Ledge Road Park as depicted on Plan Map dated 1963 to Littlefield Park?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to accept the donation of a Japanese Weeping Cherry Tree given by the family of James R. Hayes, in his memory, with said tree to be planted in Fireman's Park in recognition of his 68 years of membership with the Ogunquit Fire Department?

ARTICLE 9: Shall the Town vote to enact an Ordinance entitled the "Enhanced 9-1-1 Ordinance", as mandated by the State of Maine, in the form posted and previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use and examination by the public?


ARTICLE 10: Shall the Town vote to adopt an updated "Floodplain Management Ordinance", as proposed by the Ogunquit Planning Board to bring the present Ordinance into compliance with federal laws? A copy of the proposed Ordinance has been posted and made available in the Town Clerk's office for inspection, use and examination by the public?


ARTICLE 11: Shall the Town vote to enact a moratorium on the demolition and/or removal of pre-1930 structures as defined in Title X, Chapter 2, Article 8, Section 806 - Design Guidelines, subsection 1 of the Ogunquit Zoning Ordinance until the April, 1997 Annual Town Meeting?




