
ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside over said Meeting.


ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to transfer the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) from the Debt Service, Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) from Snow Removal, and Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) from the Insurance Account to the General Government Operations (Selectmen) Account to offset unanticipated legal fees?






