

WARRANT for the ANNUAL MEETING

of the

OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION

To CECIL F. PERKINS, a Police Officer in the Ogunquit Village Corporation in the Town of Wells, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Ogunquit Village Corporation, qualified by law to vote in Corporation affairs, to meet in Firemen's Hall in said Corporation on Monday, the sixth day of April, 1970, A. D. at One O'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following Articles:

- Article 1: To choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.
- Article 2: To choose five Overseers, Clerk, Treasurer, three Members of the Budget Committee and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 3: To see if the Corporation will vote to set the compensation of the Treasurer at \$1,000.00

- Article 4: To see what rate of compensation the Corporation will pay its Harbormaster.

- Article 5: To see if the Corporation will vote to raise the pay of its employees 10 to 12½%.

- Article 6: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$9,497.00 for the salaries of the Corporation Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 45: X To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to assist the Waban Project defray the cost of transportation of children to the summer camp.

Budget Committee recommends: \$200.00

Article 46: X To see if the Corporation will vote to name the triangular Park at the junction of School Street and Route #1 the "Major Lyle G. Brooks Park" and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to erect a monument in his memory. On petition of John Harrington and six others.

Budget Committee recommends: that the Park be named in honor of Major Brooks and that \$200.00 be appropriated for a monument.

Article 47: X To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to aid the Chamber of Commerce to carry on Chamber business for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends: \$2,500.00

Article 48: X To see if the Corporation will vote to subsidize the Ogunquit Sewer District, and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$29,500.00 to pay towards the interest on the Bond Issue.

Budget Committee recommends: appropriation of \$20,893.81 from current funds and \$8,606.19 from Unappropriated Surplus

Article 49: X To see if the Corporation will vote to enlarge the parking lots at the Beach, the Cove and the Footbridge and appropriate a sum of money therefor. On petition of Roby P. Littlefield and twenty-one others.

Budget Committee recommends: that a Committee be appointed to investigate the feasibility and costs and report at a Special or the next Annual Meeting.

Article 50: X To see if the Corporation will vote to widen the roadway on Beach Street by making the whole right of way usable by traffic and appropriate a sum of money therefor. On petition of Roby P. Littlefield and twenty-two others.

Budget Committee recommends: that a Committee be appointed to investigate and furnish an estimate of cost to a later Meeting.

Article 51: X To see if the Corporation, for the purpose of relieving the congestion at Ogunquit Square, will vote to build a bridge to the Beach at the easterly end of Wharf Lane, or elsewhere, and appropriate a sum of money therefor. On petition of Roby P. Littlefield and twenty-two others.

Budget Committee recommends: that a Committee be appointed to investigate the feasibility, furnish an estimate of cost and report at a later Meeting.

Article 52: To see if the Corporation will vote to make access to Berwick Street from the North safer and more convenient by cutting the corner of the North side of Berwick Street and appropriate a sum of money therefor. On petition of Roby P. Littlefield and twenty-two others.

Budget Committee recommends: that a Committee be appointed to investigate the feasibility and furnish an estimate of cost to a later Meeting

Article 53: To see if the Corporation will vote to cut the sharp corner on Hoyt's Lane at its junction with River Road and appropriate a sum of money therefor. On petition of Roby P. Littlefield and twenty-three others.

Budget Committee recommends: that a Committee be appointed to investigate the feasibility and furnish an estimate of cost to a later Meeting

Article 54: To see if the Corporation will vote to change the name of Cove Road to Woodbury Lane.

Budget Committee recommends: leave to meeting

Article 55: To see if the Corporation will vote to amend "Ordinances Relating to the Ogunquit Beach Area, Perkins Cove and Marginal Way" by adding: Sec. 1A: Groups of children, ten or more in number, entering upon Ogunquit Beach, shall be accompanied by a Counsellor or Guardian in the ratio of one Counsellor or Guardian for each group of not more than ten children.

Article 56: To see if the Corporation will vote to amend "An Ordinance Providing for Traffic Regulation in the Ogunquit Village Corporation" by adding: Sec. XVI-1: Parking of Trailers, Campers and Buses is prohibited in the Main Beach, Footbridge and Perkins Cove Parking Areas from June 1 to October 1 of each year.

Also to amend Sec. XXVII of said Ordinance by adding after the words "for the third and all subsequent offenses" "EXCEPT that offenses under Sections III, IV, XII and XVI shall be punished by a fine of Three Dollars for each offense.

Article 57: To see if the Corporation will vote to amend "An Ordinance Governing Marine Traffic and the Use of Waters of Perkins Cove Harbor and Public Shore Land Adjacent Thereto, and the Use of Public Wharves, Docks, Piers and Floats in Ogunquit Village Corporation":

¹ By changing Section 7 to read: Section 7: The Board of Overseers shall fix the compensation of the Harbormaster.

² By adding to Section 11: Each day that any person shall be found in violation of any of said provisions shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

³ To amend "Rules and Regulations etc" by substituting: Section 10 (a): No person or persons shall tie up vessels or boats of any description to said Public Wharves, Docks, Piers or Floats, or lie alongside thereof for a period longer than one-half hour except with permission of the Harbormaster.

⁴ To amend "Rules and Regulations etc" by adding: Section 11: All punts, dinghys and all other boats of similar description shall have the owners name lettered thereon.

⁵ To amend "Rules and Regulations etc" by adding: Section 12: No punts, dinghys or other boat of similar description shall tie up to any wharf or float without permission of the Harbormaster unless such boat shall be owned or used by the lessor of a mooring.

Article 58:

To see if the Corporation will vote to adopt the following Ordinance:

An Ordinance for Shellfish Digging License in Ogunquit Village Corporation.

MUNICIPAL SHELLFISH LICENSE REQUIRED. It is unlawful for any person to dig or take shellfish from the Shores, Flats or Coastal Waters of this Municipality without having a current license issued by the Clerk of this Municipality as provided in this Ordinance.

Definitions for the above.

"SHELLFISH" The word Shellfish means soft shelled clams.

"MUNICIPALITY" The word Municipality means the Ogunquit Village Corporation, Wells, Maine.

"RESIDENT" The word Resident when it applies to the Municipality means a person who has resided in the State of Maine for at least six (6) months next prior to the time his claim of such residence is made, and who has resided in this Municipality for at least three (3) months next prior to the time his claim of such residence is made.

"NON-RESIDENT" Meaning and intended a Non-resident Tax Paying Property Owner, may obtain a \$2.00 license, to dig ($\frac{1}{2}$) one-half bushel of clams per day.

"LICENSE DESIGNATION, SCOPE" Licensee must sign the license, designated as a Municipal Shellfish License for the Ogunquit Village Corporation which entitle the holder to dig and take not more than ($\frac{1}{2}$) one-half bushel of Shellfish in one day from the Shore, Flats or Coastal Waters of this Municipality, when and where it is lawful to do so.

"LICENSE MUST BE SIGNED" The licensee must sign his license in order to make it valid.

"QUALIFICATIONS, APPLICATIONS, FEES" Any Resident or Non-resident Tax Paying Property Owner of this Municipality may apply to the Municipal Clerk for the license required by this Ordinance on forms provided by the Municipal Officers. No other person may apply nor be issued the license provided in this Ordinance. The Clerk may require the applicant to procure evidence of his qualifications before issuing the license.

"CONTENTS OF APPLICATION" The application must contain the applicant's name, current address, birthday, height, weight, signature and whatever other information, if any, the Municipal Officers may from time to time decide.

"RECORDS" The Municipal Clerk shall note on the application the date the license was issued, sign it and file the application with his records.

"FEES" The Fee for the license is two (\$2.00) dollars which the applicant shall pay with his application.

Any person digging or taking clams in the Ogunquit Village Corporation shall have on his person and show to any Warden or Law Enforcement Officer positive identification when requested in addition to license where required.

It shall be lawful to dig or take clams during the daylight hours only. Daylight shall be interpreted to mean from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset.

"LICENSE EXPIRATION DATE" Each license issued under authority of this Ordinance expires at midnight on December 31st of the year issued.

"PENALTY" Whoever violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days.

"FORMER ORDINANCE REPEALED" The Ordinance entitle Clam Flat Ordinance, in the Ogunquit Village Corporation, Wells, County of York, enacted at the Annual Corporation Meeting on April 1, 1968 is hereby repealed.

"EFFECTIVE DATE" This Ordinance becomes effective immediately after its adoption by the Municipality.

To transact such other business as may legally come before this meeting.

The Overseers hereby give notice that the list of voters will be corrected at the above named Hall and place of meeting on Monday the day of said meeting, from 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon until the polls are closed.

The Overseers hereby give notice that the polls shall be open for voting purposes at 1:00 o'clock or as soon thereafter as may be possible in the afternoon of the day of said meeting, and that the polls will not be closed earlier than 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

The Business Meeting will be held at 7:30 o'clock in the evening of said day.
