

WARRANT for the ANNUAL MEETING

of the

OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION

1969

To CECIL F. PERKINS, a Police Officer in the Ogunquit Village Corporation in the Town of Wells, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Ogunquit Village Corporation, qualified by law to vote in Corporation affairs, to meet in Firemen's Hall in said Corporation on Monday, the seventh day of April, 1969, A. D. at One O'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following Articles:

- ARTICLE I: ✓ To choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.
- ARTICLE II: ✓ To choose five Overseers, Clerk, Treasurer, three members of the Budget Committee for three years, one member of the Budget Committee for two years and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE III: ✓ To see what rate of compensation the Corporation will pay its Harbor Master.
Budget Committee recommends: Leave to Overseers.
- ARTICLE IV: ✓ To see if the Corporation will vote to raise the pay of its employees 5% and to pay the Office Clerk the same rate as the Sewer District.
Budget Committee recommends Yes.
- ARTICLE V: ✓ To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$8,555.00 for the salaries of the Corporation officers for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$8,555.00.
- ARTICLE VI: ✓ To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for running expenses of Firemen's Hall and the New Office Building for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$3,500.00.
- ARTICLE VII: ✓ To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Legal and Engineering Fees for the ensuing year.
Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.
- ARTICLE VIII: ✓ To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,553.00 for the Contingent Account (Office Expenses) including Manager's expenses and Clerk hire.

- ARTICLE IX: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,421.00 for the purpose of defraying the Corporation's share of Social Security of its employees for the ensuing year.

- ARTICLE X: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for Indebtedness and Interest for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$12,990.00.
- ARTICLE XI: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for Temporary Loans Interest for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$760.80.
- ARTICLE XII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$4,023.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$4,023.00.
- ARTICLE XIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to authorize the Overseers and Treasurer to borrow sufficient funds for the necessary running expenses of the Corporation until such time as the Corporation shall receive the amount due from the Town of Wells, from February 15th to the date of the Annual Meeting.

- ARTICLE XIV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,500.00 for the upkeep and maintenance of the Ogunquit Fire Company for the ensuing year, all bills to be approved by the Chief, Bernard Keene.

- ARTICLE XV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$28,620.00 for the maintenance of the Police Department for the ensuing year.

- ARTICLE XVI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$9,410.00 for Lifeguard Service for the ensuing year.

- ARTICLE XVII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,450.00 for the care and planting of shade trees for the ensuing year.

- ARTICLE XXII: To see if the Corporation will vote to subsidize the Ogunquit Sewer District, and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$30,000.00 to pay towards the interest on the Bond Issue.
- Budget Committee recommends \$30,000.00.
- ARTICLE XXIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$462.50 to be paid to the Town of Wells as the Corporation's share of the cost of belonging to the York County Regional Planning Commission.
- Budget Committee recommends \$462.50.
- ARTICLE XXIV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$26,495.00 for the maintenance of Highways, Roads, Parking Lots and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$26,495.00.
- ARTICLE XXV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 plus Excise Tax Receipts for Snow Removal, Sanding and Winter Highway maintenance for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$9,000.00.
- ARTICLE XXVI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$105.00 to be paid to the Town of Wells as the Corporation's share of the cost of their Representative of the Armed Services Committee in Washington, at the request of the Town of Wells.
- Budget Committee recommends \$105.00.
- ARTICLE XXVII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for repairs and maintenance of the Marginal Way for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$1,600.00.
- ARTICLE XXVIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$9,635.00 for the expenses of the Publicity Bureau for the ensuing year.
- Budget Committee recommends \$9,635.00.
- ARTICLE XXIX: To see whether or not the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 81, Section 108, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.
- Budget Committee recommends \$300.00.

ARTICLE XXX: To see if the Corporation will vote to appoint a Publicity Committee for the ensuing year, consisting of Mr. Russell Ireland, Mr. John Parella, Mr. Harold Staples, Mr. J. Lawrence Smith, Mr. Chris Ritter, Mr. Edward Hipple and Mrs. Charles R. Perkins.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE XXXI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the operation and maintenance of Perkins Cove for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,500.00.

ARTICLE XXXII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,650.00 for Parks and Recreation for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$1,650.00.

ARTICLE XXXIII: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate for the upkeep of Beaches for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends use of Rest Room and Beach Parking Fees.

ARTICLE XXXIV: To see if the Corporation will vote to increase the Beach Parking fees to \$10.00 for a season ticket and \$5.00 for a Monthly ticket.

Budget Committee recommends Yes.

ARTICLE XXXV: To see what sum of money the Corporation will vote to appropriate to defray the cost of Warden Service for the Clam Flats.

Budget Committee recommends using License Fees.

ARTICLE XXXVI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the cost of maintaining, rent and wages for two attendants at the Jacobs Parking Lot, as per our lease agreement.

Budget Committee recommends \$4,000.00.

ARTICLE XXXVII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the support of the Memorial Library for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

ARTICLE XXXVIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the support of the Locust Grove Cemetary for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

ARTICLE XXXIX: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 toward the support of the Riverside Cemetary for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$100.00.

ARTICLE XL: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended to assist in financing the Hot Lunch Program of the Elementary School in Ogunquit, for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$500.00.

ARTICLE XLI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$42.00 to install a Street Light on Pole 23, Captain Thomas Road. On petition of Bernard Keene, Jr.

Budget Committee recommends No.

ARTICLE XLII: To see if the Corporation will vote to build a new Bait Wharf in Perkins Cove between the present Wharf and the Footbridge and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$11,000.00.

Budget Committee recommends \$11,000.00

ARTICLE XLIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 to purchase a 750 gal. pumper for the Ogunquit Fire Company (to be purchased by the Executive Board of the Ogunquit Fire Company.)

Budget Committee recommends that \$2,000.00 be appropriated from current funds and that the Overseers and Treasurer be authorized to borrow not over \$23,000.00 to make a total of not over \$25,000.00 available for the purchase of a Fire Truck. The amount borrowed is to be repaid in three yearly payments as follows: \$8,000.00 in 1970, \$8,000.00 in 1971 and \$7,000.00 in 1972.

ARTICLE XLIV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to erect a fence around the Little League Baseball Field. On petition of Charles Jones and 17 others.

Budget Committee recommends \$2,000.00

ARTICLE XLV: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$6,091.00 for a Snow Blower Loader attachment for the tractor.

Budget Committee recommends \$6,091.00.

ARTICLE XLVI: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$420.00 to install three Hydrants as follows: One on King's Highway near the residence of Carroll Clark, Jr., one on Israel's Head Road and one on Moor Street.

Budget Committee recommends \$420.00.

ARTICLE XLVII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to aid the Ogunquit Chamber of Commerce to carry on Chamber business for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee recommends \$3,000.00

ARTICLE XLVIII: To see if the Corporation will vote to appropriate a sum of money out of Beach Funds to make extensive repairs to the Footbridge on Ocean Street.

Budget Committee recommends \$10,500.00

ARTICLE XLIX: To see if the OGUNQUIT VILLAGE CORPORATION will vote to adopt a Dog Control Ordinance to read as follows:

1. Dogs to be licensed in accordance with the Statutes of the State of Maine. No dog shall be kept within the limits of the Ogunquit Village Corporation, Town of Wells, State of Maine, unless such dog shall have been licensed by its owner in accordance with the Statutes of the State of Maine.
"Owner" shall be intended to mean any person, persons, firm, association or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

2. Dogs not permitted to run at large. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, licensed or unlicensed, to permit such a dog to run at large.
 "At large" shall be intended to mean off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person by means of chain, rope or cord of sufficient strength to control the action of such dog (or such personal presence and attention as will reasonably control the conduct of the dog.)
3. Duties of Police Officers and persons having control of Impounding. Any Police Officer within the Ogunquit Village Corporation shall seize, impound or restrain any dog kept in violation of Section 1., and any dog running at large, and deliver such dog to the Dog Officer. If the owner of such dog is known or can be located with reasonable diligence, then the Dog Officer shall personally notify the owner within three days of the receipt of the dog. If the owner of such dog is not known and cannot be located with reasonable diligence, then the Dog Officer shall post, within forty-eight hours of the time such person shall have taken such dog into his possession, written notices in three public places in the municipality, giving a description of the dog, stating where it is impounded and the conditions for its release. If the owner within seven days after receiving notice, or within seven days after notice has been posted, does not claim such dog, then the Dog Officer shall dispose of the dog by sale or otherwise, in a proper and humane manner. The Dog Officer shall keep a record of every dog disposed of by sale or otherwise.
4. Condition of release. Person giving notice to owner, as outlined in Section 3 shall, with such notice give the conditions for the release of the impounded dog. Before such dog may be released or transferred to another person, (a) such dog must be licensed in accordance with the Statutes of the State of Maine, and (b) the owner or transferee shall pay to the place of impounding, a fee for board, for each day the dog has been impounded.
5. Penalties. Instead of seizing and impounding the dog, the Village of Ogunquit, may prosecute the owner of any dog running at large, and any person upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$10. nor more than \$20., plus the costs of prosecution.
6. Vaccination. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog older than four months to keep such dog, unless it has been vaccinated by a veterinary surgeon with anti-rabies vaccine. Any person found violating this provision shall be fined not less than \$10., nor more than \$20., plus the cost of prosecution.
7. Repeal of conflicting Ordinances. All existing Ordinances of the Ogunquit Village Corporation are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.
8. Effective date. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect thirty days from its passage, approval and publication.

ARTICLE L:

To transact such other business as ^{MAY} ~~may~~ legally come before this meeting.

The Overseers hereby give notice that the list of voters will be corrected at the above named Hall and place of meeting on Monday the day of said meeting, from 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon until the polls are closed.
