

WARRANT FOR A SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

OF THE

TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center, in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of June 1992, A.D. at ten o'clock in the morning, prevailing time, until eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, there and then to vote by secret ballot on Articles 1 through and including 6.

AND

To meet in the Dunaway Community Center on Wednesday, the tenth day of June, 1992 A.D. at seven o'clock in the evening, prevailing time, there and then to act upon Articles 7 and 8.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside over said Meeting.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Plan entitled "1987 Ogunquit Comprehensive Plan" be repealed and replaced by a new Plan to be known as the "1992 Ogunquit Comprehensive Plan" in the form posted and previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use, and examination by the public which includes revisions and amendments made through 1991?

ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS RELATING TO TENTING

ARTICLE 3: Shall Chapter I, Articles 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13 and 14 of the Ordinance entitled "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ogunquit," which is also known as Title X of the Ogunquit Municipal Code, be amended related to "tenting" in the form posted and previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use, and examination by the public?

ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS RELATING TO SIGNS

ARTICLE 4: Shall Chapter I, Article 2 and Chapter II, Article 3 of the Ordinance entitled "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ogunquit," which is also known as Title X of the Ogunquit Municipal Code, be amended related to "signs" in the form posted and previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use, and examination by the public?

ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS RELATING TO KITCHNETTES

ARTICLE 5: Shall a new Article entitled "COOKING FACILITIES IN MOTELS AND HOTELS" be added to Chapter II of the Ordinance entitled "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ogunquit." which is also known as Title X of the Ogunquit Municipal Code, in the form posted and previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use, and examination by the public?

ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS DESIGNED TO BRING THE ORDINANCE INTO COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LAW AND TO CORRECT INCONSISTENCIES

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Ordinance entitled "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Ogunquit," which is also known as Title X of the Ogunquit Municipal Code, be amended in the form previously made available in the Town Clerk's Office for inspection, use, and examination by the public to incorporate revisions designed to bring the Ordinances into compliance with State Law and correct inconsistencies?

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$15,000 for the Town's unappropriated fund balance (surplus) for the purpose only of supplementing those funds appropriated within Article 44 at the Annual Town Meeting held on April 6, 1992, the same, or a portion thereof, to be tendered to the Department of the Army Corps of Engineering for the purposes cited in said Article 44 of the aforementioned 1992 Annual Town Meeting?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to solicit, borrow, sign notes for and expend a sum of money not to exceed \$24,000 upon such terms and conditions as the Municipal Officers shall believe in the best interests of the Town, for the purpose of replacing the existing electric heating system within the Dunaway Community Center with an oil-fired, hot-water heating system?

The Board of Selectmen hereby gives Notice that the polls shall be open for voting purposes at ten o'clock in the morning, or as soon as possible thereafter, on the date of the said Special Town Meeting and that the polls will not be closed earlier than eight o'clock in the evening of the same day.

The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any error or change in name or address on the voting list, to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept enrollments.


A person who is not enrolled as a voter may not vote in any election. A voter who is not enrolled in a political party may not vote in a primary election.


