

WARRANT FOR A SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: MICHAEL W. PARDUE, Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit,
County of York, and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center, in said Town of Tuesday, the thirteenth day of August, 1996, A.D., at 7 o'clock in the evening to vote on Articles 1 through 8.

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside over said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: Shall the Town vote to expend the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) from the Board of Selectmen Contingency Fund for Odyssey of the Mind?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to accept a donation of two (2) elm trees to be planted in Ledge Road Park given by Norma and John Miller in memory of Brian H. Miller?

ARTICLE 4: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to accept, on behalf of the Town, donations of monies given in memory of Robert Anthony Bianchini for the planting of rosa rogas bushes in the dunes area of Ogunquit Beach and to authorize the Municipal Officers to expend such funds, including principal and interest, only for the purposes intended by the donor(s) or benefactor(s)?

ARTICLE 5: Shall the Town vote to authorize the Municipal Officers, to accept, on behalf of the Town, donations of monies for the beautification of the Ogunquit Beach Business District through the use of landscaping as specified in Title X, Article 17, Section 1705.4 of the Ogunquit Municipal Code and to authorize the Municipal Officers to expend such funds, including principal and interest, only for the purposes intended by the donor(s) or benefactor(s)?

ARTICLE 6: Shall the Town vote to adopt the following amendments to Title VIII of the Ogunquit Municipal Code (Harbor and Watercraft Ordinance)?

NOTE: CHANGES ARE MADE IN BOLD TYPE.

Amend Title VIII, Chapter 4, Section 401.3 as follows:

Replacement watercraft shall be subject to the same physical limitations as those cited in 401.1 and 401.2. **Any change in the length (size) of a watercraft must be requested in writing and approved by the Harbormaster. In the event that the request to go from a small boat mooring to a large boat mooring is approved, the mooring holder will be placed on the Mooring List according to the rules.**

Amend Title VIII, Chapter 4, Section 401.8 as follows:

~~Residents~~-Persons may, with permission from the Harbormaster and after payment of an annual \$10.00 registration fee at the Town Office, tie a rowboat, skiff, tender, dinghy, punt and/or such watercraft to the bulkhead side of the lower dock for the period from 6/1 to 9/1 as long as such watercraft conforms with all other requirements for such watercraft contained in this Ordinance.

ARTICLE 7: Shall the Town vote to appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) from taxation for Legal Fees?

ARTICLE 8: Shall the Town vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed One Hundred and Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$165,000.) to pay the costs of closing the existing burn site facility and to construct a new bulky waste transfer station on property located off Berwick Road, as approved by the voters at the April 8, 1996, Annual Town Meeting, and to fund said appropriation, authorize the Treasurer and Chairman of the Board of Selectmen to issue general obligation securities of the Town of Ogunquit (including temporary notes in anticipation of the sale thereof) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$165,000 and the discretion to fix the date(s), maturity(ies), interest rate(s), call(s) for redemption, place(s) of payment, form, and other details of said securities, including execution and delivery of said securities on behalf of the Town of Ogunquit, and to provide for the sale thereof, is hereby delegated to the Treasurer and Chairman of the Board of Selectmen.

ARTICLE 8: (CONTINUED)

EXPLANATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The purpose of this Article is to confirm and ratify method of funding the costs of closing the burn site facility and building a new transfer station as previously approved by the voters. The Board of Selectmen recommends approval of this Article.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. Total Indebtedness

A. Bonds outstanding and unpaid:	\$ 694,215
B. Bonds authorized and unissued:	\$ -0-
C. Bonds to be issued, if this Article is approved:	\$ 165,000


2. Costs

At an estimated maximum interest rate of 6.00% for a five (5) year maturity, the estimated costs of this bond issue will be:

Principal:	\$ 165,000
Interest:	\$ 29,700
Total Debt Service:	\$ 194,700

3. Validity:

The validity of the bonds and of the voters' ratification of the bonds may not be affected by any errors in the above estimates. If the actual amount of the total debt service for the bond issue varies from the estimate, the ratification by the electors is nevertheless conclusive and the validity of the bond issue is not affected by reason of the variance.


