

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT  
OF THE  
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

TO: MICHAEL W. PARDUE, Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit,  
County of York, and State of Maine:

**GREETINGS:**

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Dunaway Community Center in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of September, 1994 A.D. at 7:00 o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on Articles 1 through 6.

**ARTICLE 1:** To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

**ARTICLE 2:** Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate from taxes the additional amount of Ninety-Five Thousand, One Hundred and Ninety-Nine Dollars (\$95,199) for the Debt Service Account to correct a typographical error in the Annual Town Meeting Warrant (Article 36) for the 1994 Debt Service Account?

**ARTICLE 3:** Shall the Treasurer and the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen be authorized to issue up to \$360,000 principal amount of general obligation securities of the Town of Ogunquit, Maine to fund the unfunded portion of the costs of (1) Restroom Restoration Project (\$250,000); (2) Burn Site Closure and Site Evaluation (\$30,000); and (3) Marginal Way Restoration (\$80,000) all as previously approved by the voters at the 1994 Annual Town Meeting?

**EXPLANATION AND RECOMMENDATION:**

The purpose of this Article is to confirm and ratify the borrowing authorizations approved by the voters at the Annual Town Meeting. The Board of Selectmen recommends approval of this Article.

**FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

1. <u>Total Town Indebtedness:</u>	
A. Bonds outstanding and unpaid:	\$ 577,445.84
B. Bonds authorized and unissued:	\$ <u>0</u>
C. Bonds to be issued, if this Article is approved:	\$ <u>360,000.00</u>

2. Costs:

At an estimated maximum interest rate of 5.73318% the estimated costs of this bond issue will be:

<u>Maturity: Ten (10) Years</u>	
Principal:	\$ <u>360,000.00</u>
Interest:	\$ <u>113,517.00</u>
Total Debt Service:	\$ <u>473,517.00</u>

3. Validity:

The validity of the bonds and voters' ratification of the bonds may not be affected by any errors in the above estimates. If the actual amount of the total debt service for the bond issue varies from the estimate, the ratification by the electors is nevertheless conclusive and the validity of the bond issue is not affected by reason of the variance.
