

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL ELECTION
OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT
NOVEMBER 3, 1981

To WILLIAM P. HANCOCK, JR., Chief of Police in the Town of Ogunquit, County of York and State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet in the Judson Dunaway Community Center in said Town on Tuesday, the third day of November, 1981, A.D. at ten o'clock in the morning (10:00A.M.), then and there to act on the following Articles:

ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

ARTICLE 2: To vote by secret ballot on the following referendum question:

"Shall the Town of Ogunquit declare a moratorium on subdivision construction including multiple unit housing, condominiums, conversion of existing structures to condominiums, multiple ownership of time sharing condominiums and any other related construction to allow sufficient time for the Planning Board to study and recommend proposed changes to the Zoning Ordinance to be brought before the voters at the regular Town Meeting in March 1982; with said moratorium to expire March 6, 1982?"

(INFORMATIONAL NOTE: The term SUBDIVISION as defined in Ogunquit Subdivision Standards, Paragraph 3.1.18 shall include the actual division of land for residential and non-residential purposes, and shall include but not be limited to mobile home parks, campgrounds, and the re-subdivision of land. The term SUBDIVISION shall also include the functional division of land for both residential and non-residential purposes, and shall include but not be limited to multi-family housing, apartments, and condominiums, hotels and motels, industrial developments and shopping centers.)

ARTICLE 3: To vote by secret ballot on the following referendum question:

"Shall the Town of Ogunquit declare a Moratorium on any new commercial construction or commercial construction brought about by conversion, in order to allow sufficient time for the Planning Board to study and recommend proposed changes to the Zoning Ordinance to be brought before the voters at a regular Town Meeting in March 1982; with said moratorium to expire March 6, 1982?"

The Board of Selectmen hereby gives notice that the polls shall be open for voting purposes at ten o'clock in the morning (10:00A.M.) of the day of said election and that the polls will not be closed earlier than eight o'clock (8:00 P.M.) in the evening of said day.
