

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT

TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

Tuesday, November 5, 2002

TO: FREDERICK M. RUBINO, Chief of Police of the Town of Ogunquit, in the County of York, State of Maine:

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Ogunquit in said county and state, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Dunaway Community Center in said Town on Tuesday, the fifth (5th) day of November, 2002 A.D. at eight o'clock in the morning (8:00 a.m.) until eight o'clock in the evening (8:00 p.m.) to act upon the following articles, to wit:


ARTICLE 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting and to vote by secret ballot.

ARTICLE 2: Shall fluoride be added to the public water supply for the intended purpose of reducing tooth decay?

ARTICLE 3: Shall the Town vote to repeal the action taken on Article 9 of the 2002 Annual Town Meeting; and furthermore, shall the Town vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept easements on private roads, under such terms and conditions that are acceptable to the Selectmen, for the purpose of plowing snow on such roads by the Town upon annual authorization of the Town Meeting, provided that such acceptance: (1) allows the Town to plow snow but does not impose any obligations or duty to keep such roads in a passable condition; (2) prohibits the Town from performing any other maintenance on such roads; and (3) allows the Town to plow such roads during the winter of 2002-2003 to the extent that any necessary expenses pertaining thereto fall within existing appropriations? [Article 9 of the 2002 Annual Town Meeting states: *Shall the Town approve the concept of bringing before the Town Meeting for acceptance the dedication of a public easement over a road so that the Town Meeting thereafter will have the right, but not the obligation, to direct the Town to snowplow the public easement to the level directed by the voters where: (1) All of the owners of properties abutting the proposed public easement present executed deeds to their portions of the proposed public easement in favor of the Town of Ogunquit; (2) Said owners present a title search performed by an attorney licensed to practice in the State of Maine demonstrating that said owners have good title to the proposed easement; and (3) Said owners present a survey of the road prepared by a Maine licensed professional land surveyor depicting the boundaries and location of the proposed easement.*]


VOTER INFORMATION: The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the polls are open to correct any error in or change a name or address on the voting list, to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote and to accept new enrollments. A person who is not registered to vote may not vote in any election. A voter who is not enrolled in a political party may not vote in a primary election.
