

WARRANT RETURN FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING
OF THE TOWN OF OGUNQUIT
March 2, 1985

the Annual Town Meeting was called to order by the Town Clerk Madeline D. Brown reading the call, return and first Article. (Meeting started at 9:00 A.M.)

Sharon O'Brien, Violet Rand, Judy Shaw, Mary McClelland, Jo Ann Putnam, Pamela Dixon and Barbara Lord were Ballot Clerks.

Sharon O'Brien and Mary McClelland were Ballot Clerks for the town Meeting - 74 people attended Town Meeting.
