

WARRANT FOR A SPECIAL TOWN MEETING
RETURN OF THE
TOWN OF OGUNQUIT

The Special Town Meeting was held on Tuesday, June 10, 1997, A.D. and called to order by Town Clerk Judy Shaw-Kagiliery with the Reading of the Call, Return, and First Article.

The Meeting convened at 7:10 P.M. with seventy-three (73) registered voters in attendance. Ann Clark served as Ballot Clerk.

ARTICLE 1: Joseph Carleton was elected Moderator and sworn in by Town Clerk Judy Shaw-Kagiliery. Mr. Carleton began by advising the legislative body he would be conducting the Meeting pursuant to the Maine Moderator's procedure. Mr. Carleton also advised that a quorum of 38 registered voters were required to conduct the business at hand and it was apparent that requirement had been met. Mr. Carleton also called for Motion to allow non-residents to address the floor on issues before the Meeting. Motion seconded. Passed, by a show of hands.

ARTICLE 2: Motion was made and seconded to accept the Article, as read. Passed by a show of hands.

ARTICLE 3: Motion was made and seconded to accept the Article, as read. Passed by a show of hands.

ARTICLE 4: Motion was made and seconded to accept the Article, as read. Passed by a show of hands.


ARTICLE 5: Motion was made and seconded to accept the Article, as read. Passed by a show of hands.

ARTICLE 6: Motion was made and seconded to accept the Article, as read. Moderator Carleton called for discussion or a vote. Gentleman, from the floor, asked if an amendment could be made to certain portions of the Ordinance. Mr. Carleton explained that in keeping with State Statutes MRSA 30-A, Section 3002, amendments to ordinances require a yes-no vote. He explained further that in contacting other municipalities relative to this question, he had ascertained that the common practice is to follow State Statutes and, therefore, he would rule that the request for an amendment to the Article would be ruled out-of-order.

Discussion then ensued, from the floor, with the pros and cons of the amendment proposals being presented. Following lengthy discussion, Mr. Carleton called for vote. Article defeated by a show of hands.

Meeting declared adjourned by Moderator Carleton at 8:01 P.M.

Prior to voters leaving the Meeting place, Roberta Willing asked to speak to the floor and suggested that a committee be established to discuss the dog issues and ordinance further that would be beneficial to the Town, non-dog owners and dog owners alike. Mrs. Willing suggested the committee be comprised of 2 Selectmen, 2 dog owners, 2 non-dog owners.
